Quality of teaching and learning at School

To start with **Pre-school and key stage one** classes, teachers are continually assessing the progress and achievements of pupils, and plan for their learning programs. Pupils from *baby class, small toddlers, big toddlers, reception class, class one and class two* are well evaluated in Reading, Writing and numeracy and most of them are doing excellent as shown in the figure below;

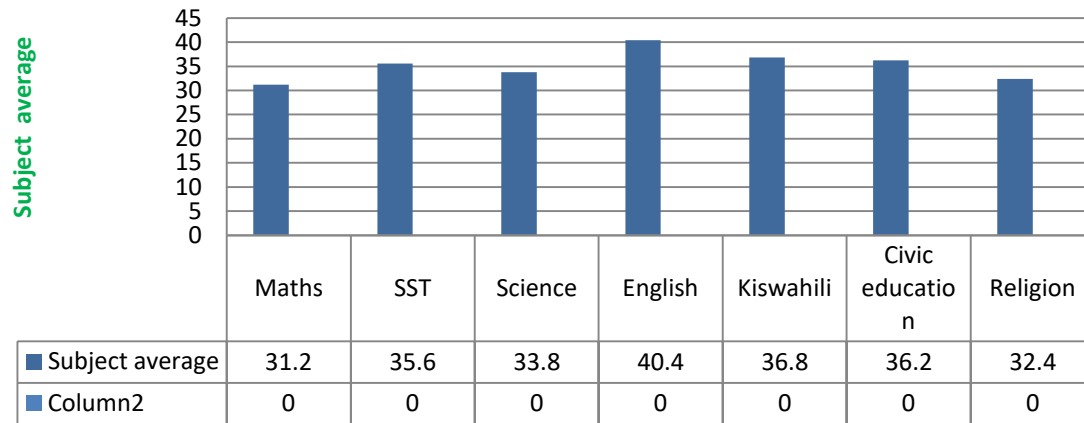
Also in class **three, five and six**, both teachers and pupils had jointly cooperated to meet the school targets by assisting each other on the suitable teaching and learning methodologies to deliver effective knowledge, values and skills to the pupils which can last long. There is a high and advanced performance in academic as revealed on the results from teachers.

Moreover, parents are given the best opportunity to be involved with their children's education in which they are asked to make appointment with their children's teachers to discuss the progress of their children both academically and socially at any time during the term.

Furthermore, examination classes (**class IV and VII**) pupils are doing well in academic both internal and external exams. Before the class seven national examinations, the trend of their academic performance was very good (**37** average), this shows that even in their last exams they will stand out and shine. Class four pupils have the overall class average of **35 (grade B)**. In this class, teachers had set up different strategies for advancing pupils academically before the Standard Four National Assessment which will be held on 28th and 29th October 2021.

Generally, teachers and pupils are working to the maximum so as to meet the school targets. The teaching of mathematics as one of our main target this term is of higher standard, whereby the performance has changed from **27** average last term to **31.2** this term, This is due to the maximum cooperation given by all teachers to the mathematic teachers in teaching this subject, especially singing of timetables everyday morning and daily homework of this subject. Not only that but also even other subjects are highly Considered and their performance is good as shown in the graph below;
