

I know I have few emails to reply and matters to get back to you. I must apologise, I have been a little poorly with what looked like malaria but I have been to the doctors and I don't have malaria, so it must have just been a really bad flu or as maybe Covid as we don't have testing at our exposure here, it's hard to know. But I feel much better now and thank God for that.

We had a great Easter. The children went at the Sogesca centre and preached, sang and just spoke to people about the gospel, especially the cross. It was amazing as we did not expect much response from the villagers but it was great to also see that our older children really got involved in this and were not ashamed to share their faith in Christ Jesus. Usually on 'Good Friday' we would walk around the village carrying the cross and reading bible verses about the story of Easter and short prayers (I introduced this few years ago as it's something we did at Earnest Street Baptist Church when we were in the UK). However, this time I thought we would do it differently and it worked out quite well.

Saturday and Easter Sunday some of the children, especially the choir, went up to Bulima and shared the gospel there with a local church connected to NTC (Nassa Theological College) and Lion of Judah. So it was a different sort of Easter and wasn't all entirely focused on just "us" here at Bethany, it was more about reaching out to the community with the gospel which I intend to do more and more in the near future.

I was wondering about forming an outreach group from the children and some of the care-workers who would be interested to get involved so that we can get more involved in ministering to the community around especially in hospitals and local families who are struggling, not only to spread the gospel but also to educate on certain matters. (This is a long way off and I'll have to think through it carefully before anything but it's an idea I have had for a while). I like walking in the village a lot and sometimes I see things that I know with a little bit of education, people's lives could change incredibly.
